Built upon the National Vaccination programme this course is to enable you to confidently, competently and effectively promote and administer vaccinations and immunisations in support of the national immunisation programme. This session will take place in a live, real time virtual environment with interactive online learning.

Remote Learning Prerequisites:

To undertake the course you must have access to a PC/laptop/device that has access to the internet and has sufficient memory and software to run MS Teams. It is recommended that this is run via the App rather than in a web browser. You will need to have practiced using this app and be able to use your webcam.

Assessment:

There is no formal assessment by the University however;

- Students are provided with a competency profile to use as a framework within their practice to identify suitability and competence to advise on and administer vaccines.

Entry Requirements:

- Confirmation of support from your line manager (evidenced on application form)
- Confirmation of support of a mentor/assessor to provide support and assess competence
- Must have previously undertaken CPR and Anaphylaxis training/updates
- Must have access to a computer/laptop/device meeting the requirements.

Specialist Skills Post Registration Development (SSPRD) funding:

SSPRD funding may be available to those meeting the eligibility criteria, to qualify you MUST:

- Be employed with an organisation who commissions NHS services.
- Work within the West Yorkshire & Harrogate District.
- Have the support and sign off from your line manager.

Each NHS area in the Yorkshire & Humber region will have a designated signatory who is to authorised to confirm that, from an organisational perspective that this level of training is required. For all GP surgeries and practices across West Yorkshire & Harrogate your signatory is based within the Primary Care Workforce Training Hub, please send your applications to tpc.traininghub@nhs.net
